

TO PUT IT TO USE

Chicago, Ill., May 19.—Part of the expenditure of the millions raised by the Baptists in their New World Movement is to be definitely voted at the meeting of the denominational convention at Buffalo, June 22, to 29. The sacrifices made by the hundreds of thousands of Baptists, who in the face of the high cost of living, contributed a total of \$55,000,000 to the cause of Christianity, and who are to continue their giving until the \$100,000,000 fund desired is raised, will be in the guile of the convention delegates in Buffalo.

The working plan to be adopted

by the convention will be one unprecedented in scope and intensity during the history of the denomination. A program will be presented by the American Baptist Home Mission Society. It has already been formulated in detail and involves work among the new Americans, benefits for the Indians, work for the Negroes, development in Latin America, in Mexico and on the frontier.

Under the general heading of work for the New Americans the Society intends to develop schools for the training of missionaries who can speak to the new Americans in their own tongues.


