HOW TO REMOVE STAINS

WITH THE SUMMER months comes the picnic and, camping season, and also the problem of removing stains from table linen and garments.

The first fact to remember is that a fresh stain comes out more easily than an old one. Some stains are set by treatment, that would remove others so it is very necessary to find out what made the stain, according to Miss Inez Richardson of the home economics extension staff at Purdue University.

The most practical method of removing fruit stains is to spread the stained portion of the material over a bowl and pour boiling water from a height so as to strike the stain with force. Camphor is likewise used with good effect. Some stains, however, are obstinate and the first

treatment should be followed by bleaching.

Stains made by iron, some bluing and some milk stains can be removed by dilute oxalic or hydrochloric acid applied drop by drop on the stain until it brightens and then immediately washed out with water. Salts of lemon or lemon juice and salt may also be used. Spread upon the stain, place in the sun, if possible, and keep moist. When the stain is removed, rinse well.

For grass stain use cold water; soap and cold water; alcohol; or a bleaching agent.

For mildew; if fresh, use cold water; otherwise try to bleach with Javelle water or potassium permanganate.

For perspiration stains, use soap and war water; bleach in the sun or with Javelle water or potassium permanganate.
