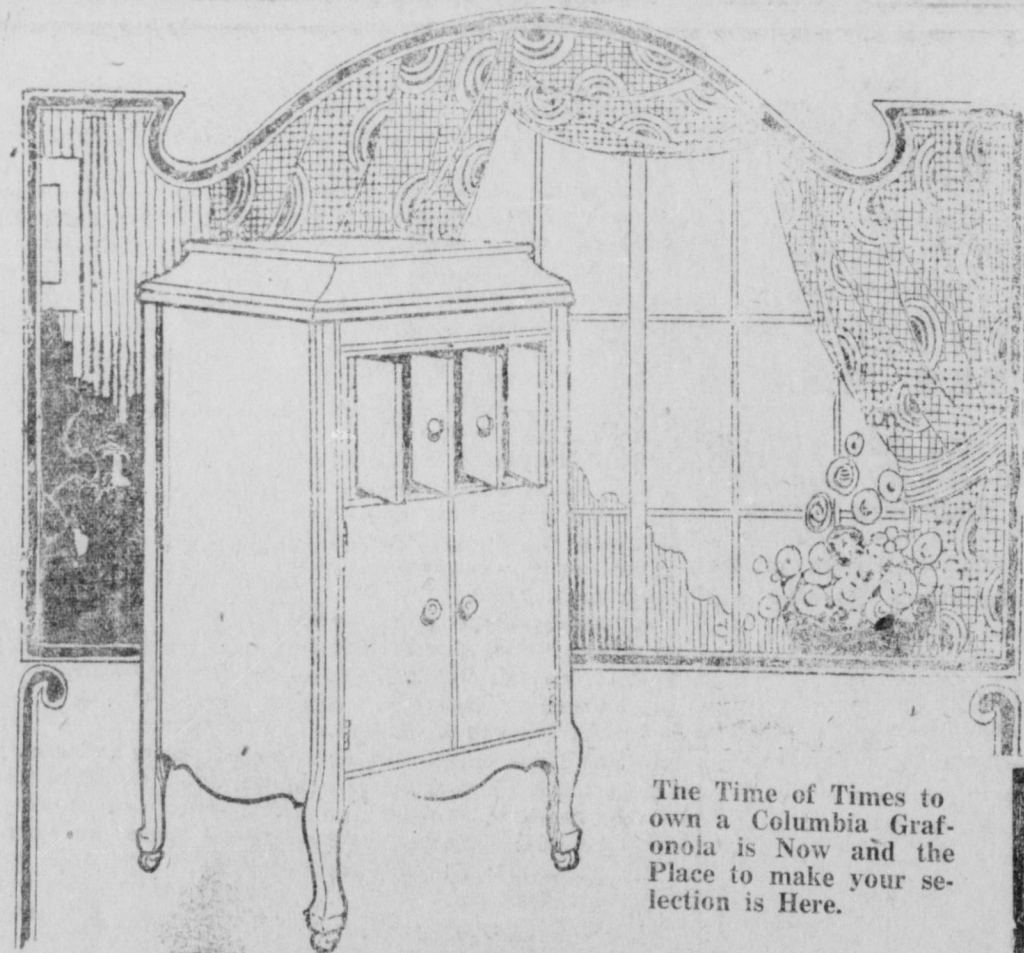

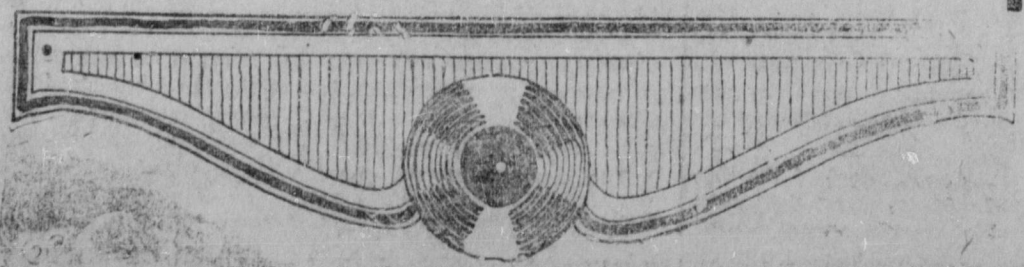

Columbus, O., Oct. 5.—(Special to Daily Democrat)—Republicans this year "will break into" the solid south Will H. Hays, republican national chairman, declared when he stopped here enroute to Marion to confer with Senator Harding. Republicans, Hays asserted, will capture all New England states and everything west of Mississippi, except Texas, Louisiana and Arkansas. He also numbered among the "certain republican states," New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, West Virginia, Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Kentucky, Wisconsin and Illinois.
