Are Voting for the Next President

16, Wilson 7.

The vote for Governor was Channing Cox, republican, 2; Walsh, democrat 5.

The polls opened at 6 a. m. and every registered voter had marked his ballot within two hours.

South Bend, Ind., Nov. 2.—(Special to Daily Democrat)—Overcast sky and cold damp atmosphere did not keep many persons from lining up at the polls before the opening hour here this morning. Several women were in the lines. Indications were that the largest vote ever polled in this vicinity would be registered to day.

Muncie, Ind., Nov. 2.—(Special to Daily Democrat)—Muncie walked out to the polls today with a determined step. Little groups of men and women lined up at the polls, 20 minutes before opening time and a continuous stream of voters of which 40 per cent were women have been moving pollward. Indications that the heaviest vote ever cast here will be voted today, with 50 per cent in by 10 o'clock.

San Francisco, Nov. 2.—(Special to Daily Democrat)—Favorable weather and a multitude of sharp local contests together with the general interest in the national campaign, gave promise of bringing out a record breaking vote in the West today.

In sections where the polls opened at sunrise, election boards were hardly in their seats before the first delegations of voters were clamoring for ballots. The "vote early" slogan had been drilled into the electors to such an extent that it was expected much of the eleventh hour rush would be avoided.

Although the Rocky mountain states reported unfavorable weather on the coast the day could not have made a better start.

Los Angeles reported a "clear, crisp, beautiful day." Early voting was brisk with voters waiting when the polls opened.

The San Francisco bay region was enveloped in its famed gray haze which didn't amount to a fog.

In the Pacific northwest the weather was cold and cloudy but not threatening rain. With the exception of a few districts through the coast states roads were in good shape and favorable to rural voting.

Most cities where early reports were available indicated the women were not very plentiful among first voters. This was believed because in most western states women have voted numerous times and have become a bit accustomed to it.

A heavy feminine vote was expected during the afternoon, however. In some cities the women were making voting a social affair, with trips to the polls followed by afternoon teas.

New York, N. Y., Nov. 2.—(Special to Daily Democrat)—The American people today went to the polls by the millions to deliver their verdict on the issues of the 1920 campaign.

Early indications in the east were that an unprecedented vote would be polled. At 6 a. m. when the New York polling places opened, knots of voters were waiting at the doors of many of them and by 6:30 there were long lines of people marching past the clerks.

Many women were among the first in line.

Election day here dawned cloudy and chilly, with a threat of rain. There was a chance that rain might keep down the vote total which seemed likely to break all records.

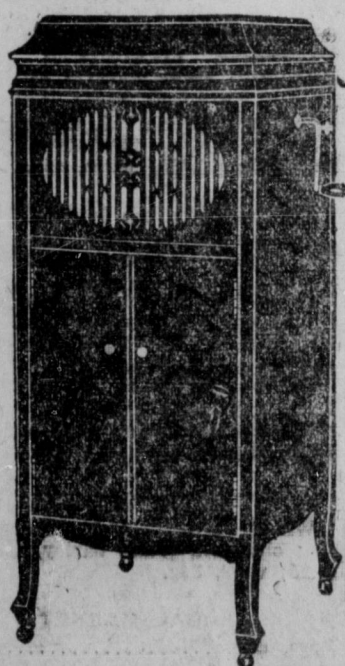
