Terre Haute, Ind., Nov. 2.—(Special to Daily Democrat)—Several thousand dollars' worth of stock certificates, warranty deeds, bonds, mortgages and other legal papers which were found by police in a coal car on the C. & E. I. railroad were believed today to be the loot taken from the Farmers State bank at Newark, Ill., on October 10th, when that bank was robbed of stock certificates valued at \$62,000.

The papers "filled an" old gunny sack in the car and some of them were so soiled the police were unable to determine their value. More than \$15,000 worth had been counted today, however.

## In Charge of Seal Campaign

Christmas seal sale campaign," said W. Guy Brown, of this city, in accepting the appointment, tendered him by Executive Secretary M. A. Auerbach, of the Indiana Tuberculosis association. "The tuberculosis campaign is one that deserves the support of every worthy citizen, and I feel sure that all members of the county committee will do their best to boost the sale of the little penny stamps that mean so much to the health of America."

"I am all the more willing to help in this campaign for the reason, which is not generally known, that the greater part of the money raised by the sale of the stamps will stay right here in our own county to be used in the health crusade. It is only fair to explain to the public that buys the Christmas seals, what becomes of their pennies, dimes and dollars. Ninety-five per cent. of the money raised will be in the state, only five per cent. going to national headquarters. Of the remaining ninety-five per cent., a little more than seventy per cent. will be used in this county. We are glad to contribute to the support of the state and national headquarters, for they provide literature, organize the campaigns, help us obtain nurses and direct the work generally.

"We want this county to have every modern facility for fighting tuberculosis—open air schools, visiting nurses, clinics for the examination of tubercular persons, and health crusade in the schools. About one death in ten is due to tuberculosis, but we can save many lives by arranging for early attention to cases. Visiting nurses will do a great deal toward cutting down the tuberculosis death rate. Health crusades in the schools will also help.

"The people of this county will be doing themselves a splendid service in buying liberally of the Christmas seals when they are placed on sale. They will be, in effect, increasing their own protection against a terrible disease.

"We expect to organize a large committee to push the anti-tuberculosis campaign. It is our aim to get the health message that the seals signify into every home of the county, with the aid of the schools, the churches, the newspapers and volunteer workers."
