Terre Haute, Ind., Nov. 2.—(Special to Daily Democrat)—Several thousand dollars' worth of stock certificates, warranty deeds, bonds, mortgages and other legal papers which were found by police in a coal car on the C. & E. I. railroad were believed today to be the loot taken from the Farmers State bank at Newark, Ill., on October 13th, when that bank was robbed of stock certificates valued at \$62,000.

The papers filled an old gunny sack in the car and some of them were so soiled the police were unable to determine their value. More than \$15,000 worth had been counted today however.
