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THE PROBLEM AHEAD:

Fort Wayne, complaining of contamination of the St. Mary's river by the discharge of poisonous waste from a sugar factory at Decatur, is apt to overlook her own part in river contamination and take little note of the problem that lies ahead. All of Fort Wayne's sewage goes into the Maumee river. That stream winds a sluggish and tortuous course from this city to the Ohio state line and thence onward toward Lake Erie. It is simply an element of luck that for a great distance no town has its seat immediately upon the banks of that stream. Were the situation otherwise, we should long ago have begun to listen to angry and aggressive complaint of our own part in river contamination. Nor is it unlikely that we shall sooner or later hear hostile complaining of our discharge of sewage into the Maumee. And if not directly out of that our problem be crystallized, it may come from general state regulations designed to prevent the contamination of water courses or from federal interference with like nuisances and dangers. In any event, it will not be an idle concern that looks to a future contingency of the sort and considers what measures will the better meet the situation. Sewage disposal by scientific methods has made immense strides within the past two or three decades and even within very recent years some of the most effectual developments have been made. That Fort Wayne at some time within the measureable future will be compelled to turn her attention practically to some solution of her sewage problem other than the easy way of pouring its streams into the natural water courses here is not a gratuitous apprehension. The time comes on when the problem will have to be dealt with. It will mean a great expense and it is not at all too soon to begin a tentative consideration of needs and a weighing of possible financial liabilities. That this problem will not press until after Fort Wayne has had ample time to deal with the problem of a permanent and adequate water supply we may feel sure, but that at length it will press we may feel equally sure.—Fort Wayne News.
