tremely anxious to maintain a solid bulwark of border states against the Bolsheviks. Estonia and Latvia are recognized as friendly but Lithuania is leaning toward Moscow.

London, Dec. 29.—(Special to Daily Democrat)—The British press today was absorbed in international disarmament. The suggestion of Secretary Daniels for an international conference on reduction of armaments was welcomed.

The Daily News clung to the belief that only the League of Nations could dispose of the armaments problem, declaring that Daniels will be retiring from official life shortly and therefore cannot pledge his country "as to armaments or anything else."

President-elect Harding's definition of "adequate navy" might mean anything, the News said. "Matters have gone far enough, nevertheless, for consideration of the next practical step."
