WEEKLY MARKETGRAM

Grain—Wheat and corn prices declined during the week. The only advance was on the 29th influenced by good report business and drought in Europe and Argentina, at the close wheat crop reports indicate damage. Export demand slow. Country offerings liberal. First car new wheat on Chicago market July 1st sold at \$1.23 3/4, graded No. 2 mixed test weight 58. Corn crop reports generally favorable; total crop estimated 3,000,000,000 bu. Corn curling reported in Nebraska; hot weather doing damage in South Dakota. In Chicago cash market No. 2 red winter wheat \$1.26; No. 2 hard \$1.31 No. 3 mixed corn 60c. No. 3 yellow corn 60c. No. 2 white oats 35c. For the week Chicago July wheat down 8 1/4c at \$1.22 3/4; July corn unchanged at 62c; Minneapolis July wheat down 8 1/4c at \$1.21; Chicago September wheat down 1 1/4c at \$1.22; September corn down 3 1/4c at 62c; Minneapolis September wheat down 2 1/4c at \$1.27 1/2; Kansas City September wheat down 3c at \$1.13 1/2.

Hay—Extremely light movement and limited demand caused prices to be only nominal in many markets. Dry weather affected pastures in several sections but buyers still discount damage. Prices practically unchanged. No. 1 timothy quoted N. Y. \$29.50; Minneapolis \$18; Memphis \$26; Atlanta \$26. No. 1 alfalfa, Memphis \$20; Atlanta \$26. No. 1 prairie, Minneapolis \$16.

Feed—Market quiet. Further declines in bran and middlings. Other feeds generally easier. Memphis cotton seed meal market a shade firmer but prices in other markets mostly nominal because of absence of demand. Supplies and offerings good. Dried brewers grains in good supply at \$16 f. o. b. eastern shipping points. Best pulp and alfalfa meal dull. Corn feeds weak, especially hominy feed. Quoted, Bran \$13.25, middlings \$13 Minneapolis; 36 per cent. cottonseed meal \$29.75 Memphis, \$30, Atlanta; white hominy feed \$23 Chicago, \$29.25 Phila.; Linseed meal \$28 Minneapolis, \$31.50 Chicago; No. 1 alfalfa meal \$18.50 Kansas City.

Fruits and Vegetables—Irish cobbler potatoes from eastern shore of Virginia advanced 50c in eastern consuming markets the past week, closing \$3.00 to \$3.25 N. Y. \$3 to \$4 in other cities. Mississippi tomatoes in four basket carriers slightly weaker in most eastern markets, ranging gen-

erally \$1.15-\$1.40, Baltimore steady at \$1.50 to \$1.60. Texas stock down seventy cents Chicago, closing 90c to \$1. California salmon tint cantaloupes, standard 45s showed a slightly broader range at shipping points, closing \$1.40-\$1.85 f. o. b. cash track. Prices in consuming markets up \$1 at \$4 to \$5 per crate. Georgia Tom Watson watermelons, medium sizes declined \$150-225 at shipping points ranging \$75-300 per car f. o. b. cash track to growers. Prices for Florida and Georgia melons declined \$600 in N. Y. closing \$350-\$550 Ga. Elberta peaches in six basket carriers \$2.00 to \$2.25 f. o. b. cash track; \$2.75-3.00 in Cincinnati. Ga. Hileys and Belles down 50c. New York \$3.25 to \$3.50. Belles \$1.50-1.60 f. o. b. cash track in producing sections.

Meats—Chicago live stock prices show net advances of 25 to 50c over price of a week ago. Cattle prices are almost invariably lower. Beef steers down 10-25c, butcher cows and heifers steady to 25c lower. Fat lambs declined 75c to \$1.25; yearlings 50c to 75c per 100 lbs. Fat ewes weak to 25c lower. July 1 Chicago prices: Hogs, top (one load) \$9.30; bulk of sales \$8.60-9.20; medium and good beef steers \$7 to \$8.50; butcher cows and heifers \$3.75-8; feeder steers

Indianapolis, July 7.—(Special to Daily Democrat)—Suits against three of the defendants named in the state's ice-trust busting effort were dismissed today when Special Judge W. H. Eichhorn of Bluffton, opened the hearing on Attorney General Lesh's application for a restraining order to prevent the operation of alleged ice trust in Indianapolis.

This leaves ten firms and one individual named in the action. It was expected Judge Eichhorn would rule on the application this afternoon.
