POPULATION INCREASING
Putnamville, March 28. (Special to ally emocrat)—The population of the state penal farm is more than 650 and

is steadily growing larger. The record number of inmates so far is 750. Out of seventeen prisoners recently

taken to the farm, fifteen were bootleggers. Authorities of the institution said the majority of inmates were dry law violators.

Two years ago the population ran around 300 and unless a change takes place in the bootlegging business, officials say, the old record will be broken.

TO REMODEL CHURCH

At a meeting of the congregation of St. Joseph's Catholic church, following the mass yesterday, plans were discussed for the enlargement of the church edifice and the erection of a parish house. As proposed, the improvement will cause an expenditure of approximately \$12,000 and plans are now being drawn by Architect Fred Nusbaumer. The church building will be moved from its present location to the east on the corner lot. A concrete basement under the entire building and an addition to house the sacristy and sanctuary is proposed. The building is to be stuccoed and made modern throughout. The interior is to be improved and redecorated.—Bluffton Banner.
