SERIES OF MEETINGS AT LUTHERAN CHURCH CLOSE

stoutly maintained the doctrine of the real presence. One of the reflections which the author casts on Luther is that he there insisted on "unquestioning submission" to the authority of the Bible. In leveling that criticism at Luther, the writer unwittingly paid Luther the highest complement as a theologian, and called attention to the very reason why Luther could not conscientiously take a stand different from what he did, and why the Lutherans today cannot give up the doctrine of the real presence. This is not Luther's doctrine; it is no man's doctrine: it is the doctrine of the Bible, of the inspired Word of God.

"The words of Holy Scripture on which this doctrine is based are above all the words of institution, Matth. 26, 26-28. In all their majestic simplicity they read: 'This is my body; this is my blood.' Or belief in the accuracy of the report that these are Jesus' words is based, first of all, on the Bible's assurance that 'all Scripture is given by inspiration of God.' Our faith in the truth of these actually being Jesus' words is strengthened by the testimony given thereto by Mark and Luke who record these words, respectively, chapter fourteen, and chapter twenty-two.

"The word 'this' is taken by some to refer directly to bread, so that the words be equivalent to 'this bread is my body.' This explanation has been used by such as believe that the bread is changed into the body of Christ, and also by such as believe it is merely a symbol of Christ's body. The Greek text gives the word 'this' in the neuter gender, and the word 'bread' is masculine. The word 'this' refers to the entire gift which the Lord communicates to us in the sacrament, of which He mentions the element: His body. "The word 'is' is taken by many to mean 'signifies' or 'represents.' Eminent students of language will tell that 'is' never means 'signifies' or 'represents.' If there is a metaphor here it lies not in the substantive verb 'is,' which is unchanging in its meaning, but in the noun connected with it, in the noun 'body.'

"Neither does it mean, 'This is my body figuratively speaking, or This is a symbol of my body, because Christ adds: 'Which was given for you, which was broken for you.' No one will venture to assert that Christ gave a figurative body, or a symbol of His body into death for us; He gave His real body. By all the laws of language Christ's words can mean only this: 'I give you my true body and by true blood.'

"Other passages of Scripture which help us to determine whether we are to believe that Christ gave us His body and His blood in the sacrament are: 1 Cor. 10, 16; 1 Cor. 11, 27-29. What kind of a Bible would that be whose
