Registration Is Larger
Than That of 1920

(United Press Service.) Indianapolis, Oct. 23.—Political war horses in Indiana sat back and wondered the other day when registration figures were announced. They are slightly larger than those of 1920, a presidential year. This is almost unheard of in an off year.

The only explanation offered was the fact that the organizations devoted most of their time to registration than to fire works.

Organization heads and dopesters, however did not worry much about an explanation. They have been active ever since the announcement making claims.

The Democrats point out that in most of the counties where decreases were shown, for there were some decreases, Harding had a majority in 1920. 
