strength by terror, plunged about in the ward which was rapidly choking up with smoke, while red flames seeped through cracks in the ceiling. "Early breakfast" was the call that brought many from their cells. Nurses and attendants succeeded in getting out 1,700 patients from other parts of the hospital not immediately threatened.

In the fourth ward, the flames had gained too much headway and while attendants still struggled with insane patients who refused to be saved, a huge water tank that had been on the roof crashed through the fire-weakened ceiling, blocked the entrance to the burning wing and all but two of those within perished.

Acting Mayor Murray Hulbert, the fire department, state hospital commissioners, Captain Arthur Carey of the suicide squad Attorney General Carl Sherman and Chief Medical Examiner Norris began separate inquiries today into the disaster.
