

Violin Lessons to be Given in Portland H. S.

Portland, March 8.—Tentative plans have been made for the teaching of violin in the Portland schools, according to announcement made this morning by Supt. J. C. Webb. Instruments for the class in the high school, will be purchased from the funds that have been collected from entertainments given by the school. Those taking the violin instruction will be in one class under the supervision of one violin teacher, all taking the lessons at one time. The teacher, it is planned, will be maintained through each individual violin, student paying for their lessons.

It is also planned to arrange a class for instruction in playing the cello.

SAW HUMAN FLY FALL TO DEATH

E. F. Gass and Daughter, Witnessed Accident in New York

E. F. Gass and daughter, Miss Marie Gass, who have just returned from New York where they went on a buying trip, were among the twenty thousand people who saw Harry "Spider" Young, a human fly plunge ten stories to his death Monday. They were stopping at the Martinique hotel and it was from the side of that building that "Spider" fell. Needless to say, it was a thriller

never to be forgotten by the two Decatur people who witnessed it.

An associated press dispatch says that but ten people attended Young's funeral held Wednesday and only two floral pieces were placed on the bier, though he had defied death thousands of times to please the public and earn a livelihood. Of the ten, two were men engaged in similar pursuits, "Daredevil" Raymond, who taught Young his risky trade, and Peter Cutis, an airplane stunt performer. A flag draped the coffin in tribute to "Spider's" war work. The widow and Young's two small children by a former marriage, were the only ones to accompany the body to Evergreen cemetery.
