Freight Train Robbed of Rich Whiskey Shipment

Peoria, Ill., April 12—(Special to Daily Democrat)—A Santa Fe freight train leaving Pekin at 7 o'clock last night, was held up and robbed of whiskey and alcohol worth. It is estimated, \$20,000 at Crandall, where the Santa Fe and the Lake Erie and Western cross, ten miles east of Peoria.

The whiskey train was boarded as it left Pekin by four men who held up the crew, forcing them to stop at Crandall, where a fleet of auto trucks was in waiting with about a score of men. About twenty barrels of whiskey, a number of barrels of alcohol and a large amount of alcohol in 25 gallon cans was transferred to the trucks.

Sheriff Niehaus of Tazewell county, with every available deputy, is searching for the trucks and whiskey. Officers throughout central Illinois are on the look out.

ENDORSE HARDING'S PLAN
