Questions About Citizens' Training Camp Answered

"Let's Go" is the Citizens' Military Training Camp Slogan. Thirty days of outdoor life at Camp Knox are offered at Uncle Sam's expense.

How shall I be greeted upon my arrival at Camp Knox? What shall I have to do the first few hours? These are two pertinent questions that enter into the minds of each candidate receiving orders to go to camp.

To begin with Camp Knox is about thirty-five miles from Louisville on

the Louisville branch of the Illinois Central to Memphis.

Therefore in purchasing tickets get one through to Camp Knox, as the local rate is \$1.33. The Illinois Central trains leave from the Seventh street station near the river, and it is the same station used by the B. O. C. & O. Big four and Southern. Trains leave at 6:45 a. m. and 12:10 and 4:15 p. m.

It will be found to be to your advantage to leave your homes at such times as to arrive in Louisville before noon.

Persons coming to Louisville on other roads having a ticket to Camp Knox are entitled to a transfer by bus from station to I. C. station. Those arriving at Camp Knox on train leaving Louisville, Ky. at 12:10 p. m. will arrive at camp in time to be examined, equipped and assigned to barracks before late at night.

Upon arrival at Camp Knox station you will see officers with red

bands around their left arm. They are to direct you to the camp. A preliminary examination is made at the railroad station by a medical officer, so that no one suffering from a contagious disease may enter camp. You will be formed in line, and the medical officer will then examine throat and chest.

After this examination you will be marched from the railroad station to the camp, a distance of about one mile and taken to the personnel officer. Just outside the office you will be served with lunch.
