

# NOTICE TO BIDDERS FOR HOSPITAL EQUIPMENT

Bids will be received by The Board of Hospital Trustees of The Adams County Memorial Hospital, at the office of Smith & Bell, in the City of Decatur, Indiana, until 5:00 o'clock a. m. Monday, May 21st, 1923, for furnishing and placing in position in the building all items listed in the following:

- 1-Refrigerator Box for main kitchen, size 72 1/2 in. wide x 24 1/2 in. deep x 72 in. high. 12 shelves. Space 25 1/2 sq. ft. Capacity 250 lb. arranged for either ice or mechanical refrigeration. Exterior walls to be not less than 3/4 in. thick constructed as follows: 12-16 in. exterior case solid wood, then heavy waterproof insulating sheathing, then 2 in. cork board, then heavy waterproof insulating sheathing, 9-16 in. solid wood, then insulating felt to serve as cushion for opal glass lining and then the 7-16 in. thick pure white enamel glass or opal lining. To be the six door type. The floor of this box to be of hexagonal vitreous tile set in cement. Exterior to be enameled white.
- 1-Refrigerator box, with privilege of buying 3 more or less; to be of the four door type, 120 in. wide, 48 in. deep x 54 in. high and built same as the box described above except that the interior finish to be in three coats of white enamel on odorless wood. To have five shelves, 14 sq. ft. shelf space, and an ice capacity of 140 lb. Exterior finish to be in three coats of flat white and two coats of white enamel.

## SCREENS

Build and install in position all window and door screens according to the following: All window screen frames are to be made of best quality clear white pine 1 1/2 in. x 2 in. with the bottom rail 1 1/2 in. x 3 in. for the full size of all window openings, top hung fastening and locking device No. 102 of Phenix Manufacturing Co., 622-644 Center street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, or The Cincinnati Fly Screen Company, Cincinnati, O., or their equal approved; All corner joints in frame to be dovetailed hardwood dowel set in glue. The window to be attached to the screen frame by means of a groove and lock strip that keeps the screen perfectly tight. Duplicate numbers are to be furnished and placed on the bottom rail of the screen frame and one the window will, making it a simple matter to return the screens to their proper places. Use Genuine 90 percent Copper wire cloth, 16 mesh, 1/16 in. diameter. All windows above the basement are to be screened, including the windows in the monitor over the kitchen. Sizes and number of windows are to be had from Oscar Hoffman, Decatur, Indiana. This contractor shall paint all screen frames in green, except lead and oil in dark green to match window sash.

The screen doors shall be furnished in place. The wood frame to be the same as style No. 34 of The Watson Manufacturing Company, Jamestown, N. Y., or equal. The screen to be LUXOR tinted Cambric. Size and number of shades can be had by applying to Oscar Hoffman, Decatur, Indiana.

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## MANY CASES OF MEASLES

Dr. Miller stated. The smallpox quarantine was lifted today. Dr. Miller requests that all cases of contagious disease be reported to him at once.
