## BUILDING ROADS

Great Road Building Program in His-  
tory of Allen County

Fort Wayne, Aug. 1—The greatest  
road building program in the history  
of Allen county is being carried on  
this summer. Seventeen roads are  
under construction.

By fall 40 miles of new concrete  
road will be finished and many miles  
of other types of construction will be  
added to the county's system of highways.

The work includes 16 miles on the  
Lincoln highway and 12 1-2 miles on  
the Lima road.
