

Says Old Parties Have
Deserted Good Principles

Chicago, Sept. 12.—The republican and democrat parties have deserted the principles of Lincoln and Jefferson, according to the people of the northwest, Senator Henrik Shipstead, Minnesota, declared in an interview here.

"Our people in Minnesota stand for the things Lincoln and Jefferson stood for, but you couldn't find one of their principles in either of the old parties as at present conducted," Shipstead said.

"As a result our people have formed what we term the farmer-labor party and we will carry it into other states."

Senator Shipstead, said Henry Ford, Senator Robert LaFollette and Senator Hiram Johnson were the favorites in the northwest for the presidency.
