

### Kenneth Shafer Attending College At Wooster, Ohio

Wooster, Ohio, Oct. 24.—Although the College of Wooster stiffened its entrance requirements considerably this fall and refused admission to pupils ranking in the lower third of their respective classes, there was no decrease in enrollment, according to figures made public by Registrar Charles R. Compton.

Seven hundred and ninety students have registered for the winter term, the same number as entered last year when the college saw the largest enrollment in its history. There is a decided increase in the number of men enrolled this fall, and a slight decrease in the number of women students.

Among the students registered at Wooster this fall is Kenneth Shafer, 908 W. Third street, Decatur, Ind. Students come from 27 different states and ten foreign countries.

China sends six students; India three; Korea two; Brazil three, and England, Japan, Guatemala, Columbia and Chile, each one.

Twenty-eight lines of work are represented in the life purpose of Wooster students, according to information gleaned through questionnaires submitted to students at registration. Almost 45 per cent of them are planning on entering the teaching profession, and 14 per cent are preparing for the ministry and missionary service. Next to these come medicine and business with 10 per cent each, and law and engineering follow with 5 per cent. The list of vocations included social service, art, music, farming, forestry, chemistry, nursing and mechanics.

### Confesses To Supplying H. S. Diplomas In Graft

(United Press Service) St. Louis, Oct. 23.—(Special to Daily Democrat)—B. H. Jolley, \$1,100 a year superintendent of schools of St. Charles county, has confessed supplying the St. Louis-Kansas City fake medical diploma ring with high school certificates at \$5 each, the St. Louis Star declared in a copyrighted article today.

Dr. Robert Adcox, St. Louis, under arrest as the clearing agent for the ring, received the diplomas and used them to furnish "requirements" to give his proteges admittance to medical schools and examinations, Jolley said.

Kansas City, Oct. 23.—(Special to Daily Democrat)—Dr. D. M. Nigro, assistant health director for Kansas City, will introduce a resolution at tonight's meeting of the Jackson County Medical society here thanking the St. Louis Star for its exposure of the "medical diploma bill" and offering the assistance of reputable doctors of the county in continuing the investigation until all fake doctors are hunted out.

H. P. Ragland, who has charge of the prosecution of members of the "ring," arrested here, will address the physicians on facts gathered by the Star.

### All Luis Firpo Needed Was a Shot of Oxygen

Chicago, Oct. 24.—If Luis Angel Firpo had been given a shot of oxygen just before that fatal second round of his fight with Jack Dempsey in New York, the South American probably would have won the heavyweight championship, Dr. F. H. McMeekham, Avon Lake, Ohio, told the United Press today. Dr. McMeekham is attending the meeting of the National Anaesthesia Research society here, and is regarded as one of the leading anaesthesiologists of the country.

Oxygen is a powerful stimulant, and if properly administered, athletes could outdo themselves, and sent present world's records toppling, Dr. McMeekham said.

"Take running, for instance," he said. "If runners were given oxy-

gen for a few moments before they enter a race, they could lower existing speed records by a considerable margin. The oxygen would give the runner his second wind and you would never see him dropping at the tape. He would finish with a great burst of speed and be as fresh as when he started."

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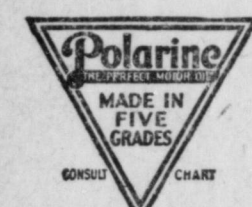
