The Board of School Trustees Board in the Berne School building at Berne, Indiana, until 2 p. m., June 25, in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by Snider and Rotz, Indianapolis, Indiana.

Separate bids will be received for the general construction of the building, and for the installation of the heating and plumbing systems, and electrical wiring.
