GREEN DEFEATS CATHEDRAL, 27-18

Local Cagers Win Exciting Game; D. C. H. S. Girls Win Two Games

In a fast and exciting basketball game, which was filled with thrills, Decatur Catholic high school triumphed over Cathedral high school of Indianapolis in the new high school gym here last night by a score of 27-18, thereby increasing their unbroken string of victories to eight. The largest crowd that has attended a game here this season witnessed the contest.

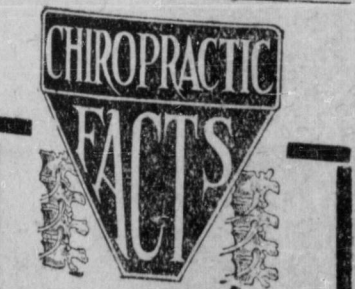
The lead saw-sawed back and forth during the first half and the first part of the second half, but in the last ten minutes the locals bombarded the basket for several field goals and forged ahead to a comfortable lead. The score at the half was 14-10 in favor of the winners. The Cathedral cagers were fast and exceptionally good at breaking up plays and dribbling. However, they were unable to penetrate the Decatur defense consistently and most of their shots were from long range. Except for a instance, the locals displayed good teamwork and repeatedly worked the ball under the net for short shots. Gass and Christen, Decatur guards, played a great game. Holthouse led in the scoring with five field goals and one free throw. Gill was perhaps the best player on the visiting quintet.

First Half
Cathedral drew first blood when Gill dropped a side shot but Voglewede soon tied the score with a two-pointer. A free throw by Christen put the locals ahead, but the lead soon switched to Cathedral when Gill caged another fielder. Another free throw and a field goal by Voglewede put Decatur ahead. A field goal by Dougherty tied the score at 6-all. Decatur took time out. Two more free throws put Decatur ahead, but Gill tied the score again with a field goal. Wemhoff, who had substituted for Laurent, dropped in a field goal and Costello tied the score with a field goal. Two pretty field goals by Holthouse in rapid fire order just before the half ended, put the locals ahead, 14-10.

Second Half
Cathedral scored two free throws and a field goal while Decatur counted one point on a free throw, tying the score at 15-all soon after the half started. Another free throw put Cathedral ahead, 16-15. Decatur took time out. Holthouse put Decatur ahead, 17-16, with a field goal. Then Christen dribble through the entire Cathedral team for an easy basket. Score 19-16. Holthouse scored two more field goals and Captain Voglewede sank one from the field, making the score stand 25-16. Cathedral scored a point on a free throw. Voglewede scored from the field again, ending the scoring for Decatur. The visitors scored one more point on a free throw just before the game ended.

In the two preliminary games, the first and second girls' teams from Catholic High defeated the first and second teams from St. Augustine, of Fort Wayne. The passing, shooting and guarding of the Yellow Jackets was far below standard and they appeared helpless before the attack of the Garrett cagers, who shot baskets from all angles. The D. H. S. girls also met defeat at the hands of the Garrett lassies, but their score was much closer, the final county being 15-12.

The first half of the boys' game ended 21 to 15. The Yellow Jackets were holding the home team fairly even. 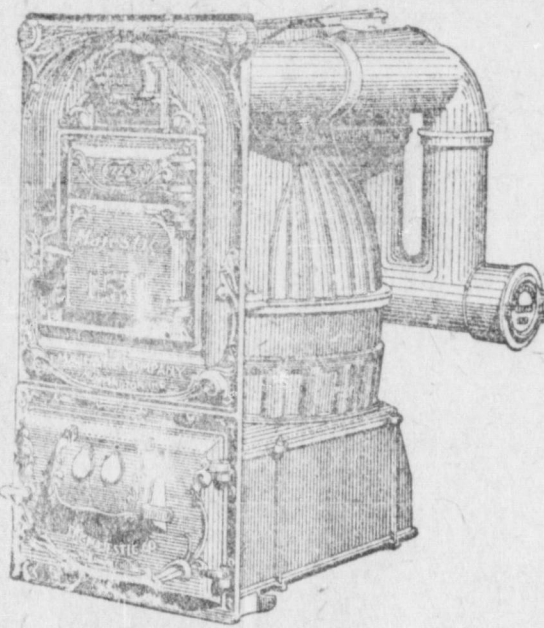
