## John A. M. Adair Seriously Injured at Washington, D.C.

Portland, Jan. 13.—Hon. J. A. M. Adair, former congressman from the Eighth district and well known resident of this city is still in a critical condition at Washington, D. C., as result of injuries sustained there several days ago, when he was struck by an automobile while standing in a safety zone, waiting for a street car.

Mr. Adair was one among a number of people waiting in the safety zone, who were knocked down when the driver of a machine lost control and drove it into the crowd. However, Mr. Adair was the most seriously injured and sustaining a fractured right arm and two fractures of the collar bone together with numerous cuts and bruises. Others were injured but not as seriously.

The driver of the machine was questioned, but later released when it was found that he was not altogether to blame. He had been hired as a chauffeur by a Washington business man, and being new at the business, became confused while turning a corner near the scene of the accident and stepped on the accelerator in trying to slow up the machine, with the result that it shot madly into the crowd waiting for the street car.
