U. S. Will Demand Debt
Payment From Russia
Washington, Jan. 14—(Special to
Daily Democrat)—When the admin-
istration reaches the point of talking
recognition terms with Russia by
way of the projected commission
which President Coolidge is said to
favor, recognition of claims for ex-
propriated property of Americans
and the Kerensky debt will be de-
manded from the Soviets in principle,
but immediate payment will not be
required.

The propaganda issue will be dis-
posed of by seeking a pledge from the
Russian government to abstain from
subversive activities in this country.

FOR SALE—Wholesale Trafficking In
Pardons Is Charged

UNITED PRESS SERVICE
Topeka, Kan. Jan. 14—(Special to
Daily Democrat)—Additional evidence
showing that there had been whole-
sale trafficking in pardons in Kan-
sas is said today to be coming out
of the investigation being carried on
by county and state officials.

Judge Paul Heins, newly installed
county attorney, is taking up the
gathering of evidence where Tink-
ham Veale, retiring county attorney,
left off.

It was announced late yesterday
that parole "attorneys" had sent let-
ters to parents and friends of convic-
ted persons, stating that they had a
political pull, and for sums varying
from \$200 to \$5,000 could secure the
grants of pardons. The amount of
money asked for, it is said, depended
upon the ability of the prisoners'
friends to pay.
