SERVES 35,120 MEALS TO SICK

Mrs. Dan Eckrote, Hospital
Cook, Averages 56
Meals Per Day

When the Adams county Memorial Hospital was opened here one year and nine months ago, the directors and the superintendent, Miss Emilie Christ, immediately began looking around for the best possible person to take charge of the hospital kitchen which has to prepare the purest and best food for patients in order that they might recover.

Mrs. Dan Eckrote, formerly of Linn Grove, was selected to take charge of the kitchen and supervise the preparation of food for the many patients. Since her selection, when the local hospital opened, she has always been on the job, and is always ready to serve the sick with the best available food.

In the last 21 months, which is the time since the opening of the doors of the hospital, Mrs. Eckrote has served 35,120 meals, or an average of 56 meals a day. If the trays in which the meals are conveyed to the rooms were placed side by side, they would make a line just three feet less than 10 miles long.

Mrs. Eckrote has personally supervised the cooking of all this food, and she says that once in a while she gets time to rest. Mr. Eckrote has charge of the hospital grounds and sees to it that the grass is kept trimmed and green and that the shrubbery is kept even.

64 BABIES BORN AT NEW HOSPITAL

Total Of 909 Patients Received Since Opening;
41 Deaths

In the period of one year and nine months, dating back to July 29, 1923, when the Adams County Memorial hospital was opened to the public, to May 1 of this year, 64 babies have been born at the hospital. This is an average of three every month. Twins were also born at the hospital.

The number of deaths which occurred at the hospital since it was opened is 41.

The total number of patients received at the hospital in the 21 months since opening is 909.

Riley Hospital To Keep In Touch With Patients

Indianapolis, Ind., May 11—(United Press)—Officials of the Riley Memorial hospital for crippled children and officials of the state board of health have agreed on a system of following up patients of the hospital who have been returned to their homes after treatment.

According to the plan tentatively arranged, the hospital is to notify the health board whenever it furnishes a child to his home. The health board, in turn, will carry the information to the local health nurse, who will be authorized to administer whatever attention the hospital may prescribe.
