Dawes Raps Opponents Of His Senate Rules Plan

Birmingham, Ala., May 28—Opposition to a change in the rules of the United States senate comes only from those whose individual power is threatened, according to Vice president Charles G. Dawes.

The vice president set forth his view once more last night when he spoke here from the same platform as Senator Oscar W. Underwood, democratic leader.

"These rules," Dawes said, "in their present form encourage parliamentary misbehavior of individual senators and invite selfishness, mediocrity, vanity and personal purpose to cloak themselves in the role of arrogance."

He said the present rules of the senate "operate at times to destroy majority rights given by the constitution."
