Suit For Divorce

A suit for a divorce and \$1,000 alimony was filed in the circuit court here today by Elizabeth Williams against Grant Williams, aged residents of Blue Creek township. The complaint states that the parties involved were married on September 12, 1889 and that they separated in August 1925. Mrs. Williams alleges that her husband often would fly in a rage at her, sulky and quarrel and maintain an attitude of anger and sulkiness until it affected her general health and nerves. She avers further that her husband refused to support her, that he refuses to pay the taxes and insurance, and that he carries away and disposed of her interest in the crops on their farms and threatens to take everything off the farm. Five children were born to the couple and all are married. A petition for an injunction and restraining order filed by the plaintiff was sustained by the court today and the defendant was restrained from molesting or interfering with the plaintiff, from entering upon the premises where she makes her home and from selling or disposing of any of his personal property until further order of the court. Attorney C. L. Walters, of Decatur, is counsel for the plaintiff.
