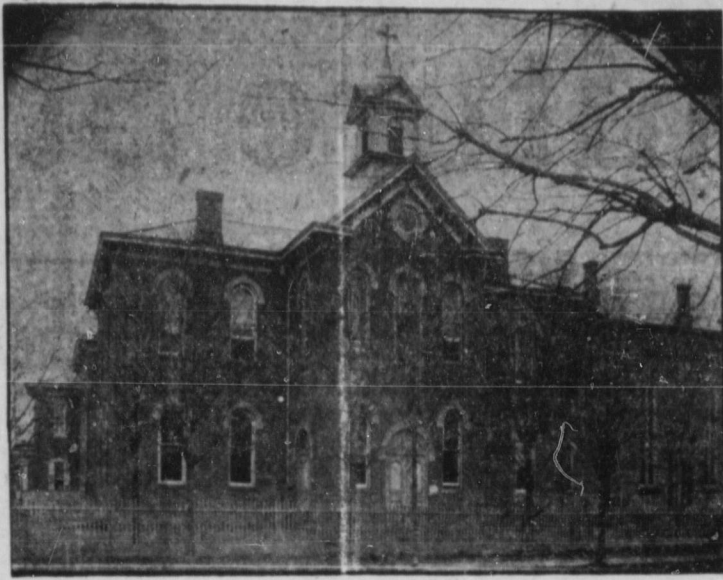

### Long Search For An Alleged Murder Ends

Chicago, Oct. 13.—(United Press.)

—An eighteen months quest for an alleged murder ended here last night, when Edward Fitzgerald, alleged Chicago gunman, wanted in connection with the murder of Thad Fancher, a Crown Point, Indiana lawyer, was arrested.

Fitzgerald refused to sign a waiver and return to the Indiana town with authorities who called for him. He will ask for a writ of habeas corpus.

John O'Reilly is now serving a life term in the Indiana state prison for his part in the Fancher slaying, and Alexander McCabe was recently acquitted on a charge of murder in connection with the slaying.
