## TWO PERSONS INJURED WHEN CARS COLLIDE NEAR THIS CITY

The two cars met at the crossroads eight miles southwest of here, and both were overturned. The occupants of the Whitaacre car were thrown from their auto and Mrs. Whitaacre was pinned beneath it. The other occupants were badly shaken but not seriously injured. Mr. Baumgartner was thrown out of his car, alighting on his head, and, besides several minor injuries, he suffered a fractured skull.

Unengaged Operation  
The injured man underwent an operation late last night at the Adams County Memorial hospital, but his condition was still serious today and his recovery is doubtful. All occupants of both cars were brought to this city.

It was stated today at the hospital that it would be impossible to ascertain the extent of Mrs. Whitaacre's injuries for several days. Her chest was badly crushed and it is feared that she may have suffered internal injuries. Several X-ray pictures were taken today of the lady.

The cars were both partly demolished, tops being torn off and wheels broken in the collision. It is thought that neither driver saw the other coming.

Minor Accidents  
A Ford touring car, whose driver's name was not learned, struck a beet wagon near the Dent school house, east of Decatur, last night. The car was going east and the two horse wagon was headed toward this city with a load of sugar beets.

There were no lights on the Ford car and the driver ran directly into the horses. The two horses were injured and the Ford car was damaged, but none of the occupants of either the auto or the wagon were injured.
