### State To Probe War On Hoosier Truck Drivers In Ohio

Indianapolis, Nov. 6. — (United Press)—Members of the Indiana Public Service commission may go to Columbus, O., next week to confer with officials there regarding the war now being waged against Indiana truck drivers operating in Ohio, it was indicated today.

A conference between truck drivers and members of the commission was scheduled for this afternoon. Frank T. Singleton and Clyde H. Jones will conduct the hearing.

At a recent conference with Gover-

nor Jackson, the truck drivers outlined their grievances and were assured of the support of the executive. Ohio officials have been arresting Indiana drivers not equipped with Ohio certificates. It is said that these certificates cannot be obtained in less than two months.


### State May Sue H. B. Smith For Money Misappropriated

Indianapolis, Nov. 6. — (United Press)—The possibility of a civil suit by the state of Indiana to recover money said to have been misappropriated by Harry B. Smith while he was adjutant general of the Indiana National Guard, was seen here today.

Lawrence Orr, chairman of the state board of accounts, has placed in the hands of the attorney general a report showing that Smith misappropriated approximately \$30,000 worth of state and federal funds and equipment.

An explanation of the appropriation made by Smith accompanied the report.

However, both defense and prosecution attorneys may have some points that will not come out until the trial gets into motion.
