holitzer died by her own hand.

Dr. John Williams, Indianapolis physician, testified that in his belief the girl's death was caused by bi-chloride of mercury taken after the alleged attack by Stephenson.

His testimony, practically identical with that of other medical experts previously called by the defense, was intended to drive home the theory of suicide.

The suicide theory and the hint that the dying statement of Miss Ob-erholitzer was a forgery appeared today as the two main lines of the defense's case.

A day and a half was spent by Eph Imman, chief defense attorney, in presenting medical evidence in support of the suicide theory.

The hint of forgery in the death statement was made during examination of state witnesses by Imman.

Stock Market Launches Into Another Boom Day

New York, Nov. 6.—(United Press)—The stock market launched into another spirited day of trading at the

opening this morning with the buying order which came in overnight from outlying parts of the country only slightly less than yesterday.

The first hour of trading saw transfer of 605,800 shares of stocks against 702,700 which yesterday changed hands in the opening hour and set a new record.

Philadelphia, Nov. 6.—Fire broke out on the battleship Arkansas in drydock in the navy yard here today.

The fire was below decks and clouds of smoke issued from the starboard side of the ship.

The ship was in drydock for her routine overhaul.

Darrow Takes Part In Murder Trial At Detroit

Detroit, Nov. 6.—Additional witnesses were to be called today by Prosecuting Attorney Robert M. Toms in the trial of Dr. and Mrs. Ossian H. Sweet and nine other negroes, charged with the death of Leon P. Breiner, in an effort to sup-

port the state's contention the defendants conspired to shoot to kill in event of an attack.

While Clarence Darrow, chief defense counsel, has not yet announced what line the defense will take, it is understood he will insist that any shooting from the Sweet home was prompted by fear of attack and in defense of the home.

Breiner was shot and killed on the night of Sept. 9 on the day following the Sweet's advent into a white neighborhood.

Raph Updike Badly Injured In Accident

Danville, Ill., Nov. 6. — (United Press)—Congressman Ralph Updike, Indianapolis and three other men were badly injured today in an auto accident near Covington, Indiana.

The driver of the machine failed to make a sharp turn near Covington and

the auto turned over three times landing in a deep ditch at the side of the road.

The four men were brought to a hospital here and x-rays made.

Updike's companions were his brother, Edgar, and Thomas Bledsoe and Ned Russell. Edgar Updike and Russell were hurt internally.

Portland Man Sentenced For Receiving Stolen Goods

Indianapolis, Nov. 6. — (United Press)—Fred Foreman, of Portland, was sentenced today to two years in the federal prison at Leavenworth on his plea of guilty to the receiving of stolen government property.

He was also fined \$200. Kenneth Smith, of Spiceland, Russell Lukes, Lloyd McBermond, and George Newman, all of Chicago, were sentenced to six months in the Marion county jail.
