Remy said.
Remy paused, took one step toward the three defendants and glared at them, then turned his attention again to the jury.

He read the definition of first degree murder as set out in Indiana law.

"Madge Oberholtzer would be alive today if it were not for the unlawful act of Stephenson, Klenck and Gentry," Remy said.

"They have destroyed her body and have tried to destroy her soul.

"In the last few days they have tried to dishonor her morals. They didn't attack her character directly. They didn't dare to.

"So they tried it by innuendo. They placed their own private coterie of men on the stand to testify for them. These were the only men they could get to say a word in their defense."

Serious Fighting In Damascus Is Reported

London, Nov. 12—The Damascus correspondent of the Daily Mail cables that severe fighting between French forces and guerrillas is reported near Nebk, between Damascus and Homs.

Federal Irrigation Project Sold At Auction

Williston, N. D., Nov. 12—A federal irrigation project goes under the hammer here today.

The plant, established in 1906 to irrigate this section and supply electric current for the town of Williston is operated as a power plant this year under a special appropriation congress granted last spring. Decision of congress not to appropriate any more funds for the irrigation feature curtailed the sugar beet crop here last year.
