Tuberculosis Can Be Cured If Discovered Early

Indianapolis, Nov. 13.—Tuberculosis can be cured in the majority of cases if it is discovered early, but if not found until its ravages have proceeded in the human body for some time, it is hard to cure at all. This statement prefaces a bulletin sent out today from the Indianapolis headquarters of the Indiana Tuberculosis Association to secretaries of nine-two county associations now engaged in preparations for the annual tuberculosis Christmas Seal Sale throughout the state. Proceeds from the sale will finance work against the White Plague in 1926, according to announcement here today by Dr. William Lowe Bry-an, chairman of the sale this year. The bulletin emphasized certain truths about the prevention and cure of tuberculosis which have just been summarized by Dr. Charles L. Minor, of Asheville, N. C., in a book written for the National Tuberculosis Association and devoted to the latest developments in the battle against tuberculosis.

"In early cases of the disease, proper food, rest in the open air by day, and, if possible, by night, clean surroundings and the help of an intelligent doctor will do wonders. Since, if tuberculosis is to be cured, it must be found out early, it is very important to understand the early symptoms that warn us of its presence. Unfortunately, many doctors do not give special attention to this disease, and

overlook it until too late or mistake it for other things, especially grippe, a chronic cold, malaria, stomach trouble or nervous prostration. A careful doctor will always strip your chest to the skin for examination. No examination through the clothes is of any use at all. Further, he will study your temperature every two hours for at least a week, will have your sputum examined in every case, and will go very carefully into the past history of your case and your surroundings. If these are not done, it may be impossible to find out the trouble in any but advanced cases. If you cannot get a doctor to examine you in this thorough way, go at once to the nearest dispensary clinic or health center in 1926, according to announcement by someone familiar with this trouble."

If it is possible to obtain expert advice, intelligent study of symptoms of tuberculosis may make the individual reasonably sure concerning his condition, the bulletin states. It points out that tuberculosis begins in different ways, usually gradually.

The bulletin goes on: the patient develops a slight cough, often but not always in the morning, which will not yield to treatment. Any cough that lasts more than three weeks should be regarded as suspicious. A chronic cough with spitting lasting for years, even though it has never made its owner sick, is very suspicious.

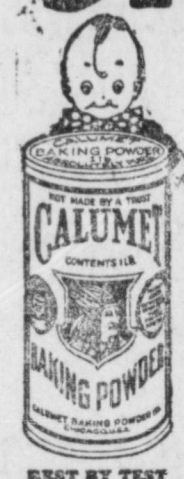
There will be no instruction for the catechetical class at the Zion Reformed church on Saturday, as the pastor is out of the city. All copy of the catechisms will kindly take place.
