Army and Navy Bring Grid Season To Close

Chicago, Nov. 27.—(United Press)—"Enemies under one flag"—the Army and Navy—clash tomorrow at New York in a game that will bring the 1925 football season to a close.

Virtually all the other teams were disbanded today after the turkey day contests that finished the season for everybody but the service squads.

Winding up a season that has been replete with upsets, Nebraska's Cornhuskers raised up on their haunches at Lincoln yesterday and sent Knute Rockne's fine Notre Dame team back to South Bend, nursing the injury of a 17 to 0 defeat.

Most of the other games on the Thanksgiving program ran true to form, Penn defeating Cornell, 7 to 0, in the outstanding battle of the east. Brown and Colgate, two evenly matched teams, fought to a 14 to 14 tie; Syracuse mauled Columbia, 16 to 5; Pittsburgh beat Pennsylvania State, 23 to 7; Marquette's "Golden Avalanche" turned back Mercer, 30 to 0; Tulan beat Centenary, 14 to 0; Alabama swamped Georgia, 27 to 0, and out on the coast Washington defeated Oregon, 15 to 14.

With the exception of Notre Dame's failure to win a western title, none of the games effected sectional championship.

Thirty-Gallon Still Found In Residence

Shelbyville, Ind., Nov. 27.—(United Press)—Grover Snapp is in the county jail here today following discovery of a 30-gallon still at his home.

MONROE DEFEATS MONMOUTH FIVE

Nip-and-Tuck Basketball Game Here Wednesday Night Ends In Scrap

In a nip-and-tuck game played in the old gymnasium here Wednesday night, the Monroe high school team defeated the Monmouth quintet, 15-13. Monmouth led at the end of the first half, 8-7, but a Monroe rally in the second period turned the tide. G. Smith, Monroe forward, was the leading scorer of the game, with three field goals and three foul goals to his credit. Brokaw led the Monmouth offensive with two field goals and two pointers scored from the foul line. This was the second victory in six starts for Monroe and the third straight defeat for Monmouth. Monmouth has lost its last two games by narrow margins.

In a preliminary game, the Monmouth grade team defeated the Monroe graders, 21 to 6. The first half ended 10-6 and the Monroe lads were unable to score in the second period. Hill starred for Monmouth with six field goals and one free throw to his credit.
