deaths from tuberculosis in Indiana. Last year, there were only 2,520 deaths in Indiana. This means a saving of 631 lives in one state over 1920. The circular points out that the work is worth while and everybody is urged to use the Christmas Seals on the Christmas packages and letters instead of other seals.

There are at present about 25,000 active cases of tuberculosis in Indiana alone. This great society is making an effort to save these people and cure them, the circular continues. This can be done if the Christmas Seal is supported as it should be.

Lodges and organizations in the county will be asked to buy Health Bonds again this year. Mr. Brown stated this morning. Most of the organizations in the county responded last year and it is highly probable that they will do so again this year.

The seal this year is very attractive. It is in three colors, red, green and white. It bears the inscription, "Merry Christmas And Good Health." Everyone is urged to buy them and use them.

OPENING GRAIN REVIEW

Chicago, Dec. 5.—(United Press)—Grain futures went into another sinking spell in opening business today. Resumption of profit taking eased wheat prices fractionally. Underlying sentiment remained bullish but the advance aggregating thirty cents, was regarded as enough for the moment.

Corn sagged with wheat. There was evidence that plenty of profits would be taken during the short session. Oats were without fluctuations. Provisions dropped on house selling.
