Corn futures were fairly active. The lighter movement and unfavorable weather brought in a more active cash demand.

Oats made moderate gains with other grains.

Club members are urged by Todd Stoops, secretary-manager to aid police officers in apprehending and arresting all motorists guilty of such conduct.

Under the state law any motorist who fails to stop after an accident is liable for a heavy fine to which may be added imprisonment.

This law provides that any motorist involved in an accident must stop, give his full name, the license number of his car and his address to either the police or the injured parties.

"The state is being overrun by this type of driver," Stoops said. "He is a real menace not only to the law abiding motorist but to all pedestrians."
