**Leghorn Hen Is Champion**  
Layer Of Seventeen States

Kendallville, Ind., Dec. 7.—(United Press)—John Seidel, of this city is very proud of Jenny, his single comb white leghorn hen.

The hen recently was awarded a prize as the champion layer of seventeen states in a contest conducted by the Michigan agricultural college. More than 1,000 other hens were entered.

Seidel's hen, which won with a margin of fifteen eggs to spare, established a record of 308 eggs in one year. The best previous record was 285 eggs in one year.

The hen also set a record for consecutive laying with eggs on 56 consecutive days.

#### Epidemic Of Scarlet

Fever Under Control

Evansville, Ind., Dec. 7.—(United Press)—The prevalence of scarlet fever here, which was thought to have reached an epidemic stage, has been brought under control by city and county health authorities. The total number of cases in the county now stands at 120.

## PLEA IS MADE FOR NEAR EAST

### Impressive Service Held At Christian Church In Linn Grove Sunday

Perhaps the most impressive meeting held in Adams county this year on behalf of the Near East campaign was that in the Christian church at Linn Grove last evening, held under the auspices of that church and the evangelical congregation of that place.

The meeting followed the regular evening services when the pastor announced the purpose of the gathering and, after opening the services with song and prayer, turned the meeting over to the chairman, Mr. Fred Studler. French-Quinn, of this city, delivered the address, a powerful plea for aid for the unfortunate children of the Near East, whose very existence depends upon the great heartedness of the people of this land, who have never yet failed nor ever will to lend a charitable hand to the unfortunate.

Following the services, a collection, most pleasing to those in charge, was taken. The commodious church was crowded for the occasion and the special music as arranged was wonderful.

### Open Campaign Against "Hit And Run" Drivers

Indianapolis, Dec. 7.—(United Press)—The Hoosier Motor Club today began a state-wide campaign against the "hit and run" driver, who fails to stop after an accident.

"From all parts of the state we are receiving complaints against the driv-

er who fails to halt his automobile following an accident," an official of the club said today.

Club members are urged by Todd Stoops, secretary-manager to aid police officers in apprehending and arresting all motorists guilty of such conduct.

Under the state law any motorist who fails to stop after an accident is liable for a heavy fine to which may be added imprisonment.

This law provides that any motorist involved in an accident must stop, give his full name, the license number of his car and his address to either the police or the injured parties.

"The state is being overrun by this type of driver," Stoops said. "He is a real menace not only to the law abiding motorist but to all pedestrians."
