## MUCH DAMAGE CAUSED BY DOGS

### County Auditor Pays Out \$2,800 This Year For Stock Damaged by Dogs

County Auditor Martin Jaberger has paid out more than \$2,800 out of the dog tax fund this year to farmers for the damages to sheep and fowls. Stray dogs have been doing a great deal of damage this year, especially to sheep. In October, the losses paid for sheep, which the dogs killed, amounted to \$563. This month, the losses total \$372.50 to date and one or two claims are pending before the board of commissioners for allowance.

Mr. Jaberger urges farmers to be on the look-out for stray and sheep-killing dogs. According to law, dogs which are caught killing sheep must be killed before the claims can be paid.

### Fight On Volstead Law Scheduled to Open Tuesday

Washington, D. C., Dec. 14.—(United Press)—Bombardment of the prohibition law by the newly formed wet bloc will begin in the senate tomorrow. Senator Edge, New Jersey, republican, author of the two bills to legalize beer manufacture, announced on the floor that he would address the senate tomorrow morning at the conclusion of morning business on the subject of "modification of the Volstead act."

The announcement was greeted by a shout of "aha" from a member of the Democratic side, and there was a ripple of laughter.

### Jury Trial Held In City Court Today

The case of Bart Schraluke and the state of Indiana vs. Abe Bagley, alleged to have violated the motor vehicle law by operating an automobile with only one license plate, was heard in Mayor's court today.

The case started at 10 o'clock this morning and the evidence was heard before a jury of twelve men. C. L. Walters represented the defendant and John T. Kelly, prosecuting attorney, represented the state. The case went to the jury about 2:45 o'clock this afternoon. No verdict had been reached by press time.

### Suit For Damages

Herman C. Weber, a young farmer residing in Root township, has filed a suit in the Adams circuit court, against William and Emella Klink, demanding judgment for \$5,000 for alleged false, scandalous and defamatory remarks made about him. The plaintiff says that he is married to Hannah Klink, a daughter of the defendant's, and that shortly after their marriage, his wife's parents caused her to file suit for divorce against him. He alleges further that the defendants wrote a letter to his parents in Fort Wayne which contained "false, scandalous, malicious and libelous" matter concerning the plaintiff. He says he has been greatly chagrined, humiliated, and disgraced and has been subjected to public scandal and mortification and has been damaged in his business as a farmer. Attorney R. C. Parrish, of Fort Wayne, is counsel for the plaintiff.

### Suit For Divorce

A suit for divorce, filed in the Allen

superior court by Pauline Sommerfeldt against William Sommerfeldt, has been venued to the Adams circuit court for trial. The plaintiff charges failure to provide in her complaint. Attorneys Yable and Teeter are counsel for the plaintiff.

### Suit On Account

A suit on account, filed in the Allen superior court by the Indian Refining company against Joseph Egan, has been venued here for trial. Judgment for \$500 and costs is demanded. Attorneys Heaton and Heaton represent the plaintiff.

### Letters Issued

Letters of administration have been issued to Reuben Lord in the estate of Martin Lord. Bond in the sum of \$1,000 was filed.

### Another Arrest Made At Evansville Sunday

Evansville, Ind., Dec. 14.—One man was arrested by deputy sheriffs Sunday as a sequel to liquor raids staged here Friday by a squad of federal officers under George Winkler, "flying squadron" chief, with 53 arrests made within a few hours.

Approximately 20 other warrants are in the hands of local officers who

are looking for the men and women who escaped the dragnet upon "tips" received after the raids started, officers believe.

### Vote Against Seating Senator-Designate Nyc

Washington, D. C., Dec. 14.—(United Press)—The senate privileges and elections committee, by a vote of 9 to 2 voted against seating Senator-Designate Gerald P. Nye, of North Dakota. It will so recommend to the senate which will finally decide the matter.

### Crazed Drug Addict Tries To Rob Druggist

Evansville, Ind., Dec. 14.—(United Press)—Louis Wolfgang, druggist employed a revolver Sunday night at a crazed drug addict, who brandished a knife in front of his face at the store and demanded morphine.

Two hours later, police took into custody, Sam Cohen, 30, Pittsburgh, Pa., who admitted the attempted robbery as he continued to demand the drug. One of Wolfgang's shots took effect in Cohen's arm. When arrested, Cohen was driving a stolen automobile.

### Three Deaf Mutes Held For Assault and Vagrancy

Indianapolis, Dec. 14.—Court officials here were in a quandary today regarding the arraignment of Fred Fox, of Indianapolis, and Ashley Runyon and Manford Clark, of Kokomo, arrested on assault and battery and vagrancy charges. All three of the men are deaf mutes.

The trio was arrested after a fight here in which Fox was severely beaten.
