Hundreds of cases of tuberculosis in Indiana have been cured by the society and thousands of underfed children have received proper care during the school year by means of the Tuberculosis fund in the various counties.

The schools throughout the county are reporting favorably in the sale of the seals and not a single school has failed to meet its quota in the sale of the seals. The city schools are expected to do the same, at least. A total check on seals will not be made until the sale is over throughout the county, it was said today.
