Major Tournament: 1st prize, Loving cup or \$10.00 in cash and the Championship of the State of Indiana; 2nd prize, Gold Medal or \$5.00 in cash.
Minor Tournament: 1st prize, silver medal, or \$3.00 in cash; 2nd prize, bronze medal or \$1.00 in cash.


