Dodge Brothers Make Reduction In Prices

Advertisements released for publication this week announce a sharp reduction in the prices of all Dodge Brothers Motor cars.

The announcements are unusual in that the amount of reductions is not given, although the word "tremendous" is employed in conveying an idea of their magnitude.

The unusual is further injected into the situation by the fact that the reductions are made retroactive. Although the new prices will not be actually announced until January 7, they are effective immediately.

"When the new prices are made known on January 7," the advertisement reads, "the full amount of the reductions will be immediately refunded to all purchasers since December 15."

The purchaser of a Dodge Brothers Motor car is, therefore, in the unusual position of not knowing the price of the product he is buying.

"He does know, however," said T. J. Durkin, local Dodge Brothers dealer, "that Dodge Brothers have always given exceptional value for the money and he also knows that Dodge Brothers, Inc., is an institution that may be relied upon absolutely to fulfill its slightest obligation to the public."

"They have announced that this reduction will be a very substantial one and that means that it will be

very substantial. Naturally I have not been informed as to the prices, but I am sure that they will be actually sensational."

The advertisement declares that the reductions are made possible by the completion of a \$10,000,000 expansion program—new buildings and equipment that will double the capacity of Dodge Brothers factories in 1926.

"There is no change in the policy upon which Dodge Brothers established their leadership 11 years ago," the advertisement concludes, referring to the policy of constant improvement without yearly models."

Detours And Bridge Run-arounds Removed

Indianapolis, Ind., Dec. 18.—(Special)—Three detours and bridge run-arounds on state roads were removed this past week, and two additional run-arounds will be lifted Sunday, according to the state highway commission's traffic bulletin issued today from the office of John D. Williams, director.

Attention was called that maintenance forces have the gravel and stone surface mileage of the state system in splendid shape for winter traffic demands, and that this division of the department is prepared to meet emergencies and keep traffic going all over the system this winter. At several places where weather conditions prevented completion of paving contracts, the commission is using stone and gravel on the roadbeds to permit traffic to go through without detouring until such time early next spring when paving operations can be resumed.

Thieves Throw Merchandise From Moving Freight Cars

Jersey City, N. J., Dec. 18.—(United Press).—Merchandise carried in two freight cars of an Erie railroad train operated by an express company from Jersey City to Chicago was thrown from the cars last night by thieves who apparently had secreted themselves in the train before it got under way.

Railway detectives, after the robbery had been discovered, found scores of packages strewn along the right of way. The robbers were be-

lieved to have been confederates in motor trucks who were following the train.

Total value of the loot is not known, pending a checkup. One unconfirmed report was that the stolen merchandise was valued at \$100,000.

To Investigate Fading Of Broadcasting Stations

Investigation of "fading" on a scale never before attempted in the United States will be made in mid-January at twenty observation stations, it was announced today by J. K. Smith of the Stewart-Warner corporation.

Hitherto such experiments have been carried on in isolated sections of the country between two or at most three stations. The results of such research have been negligible. There is still no explanation of why signals should be stronger in the winter when static electricity leaps out of one's hair or sparks out of the rug at one's feet, and weak in summer when there are apparently no static charges in the things about us, according to Mr. Smith.

The Stewart-Warner observation posts will chart readings on selected distant stations every two minutes during the period of the tests. The results will be averaged and plotted on a map similar to that issued by the government weather bureau. It is the belief of the engineers conducting the tests that curves which will make possible a comparison of effects and a search for causes will result. If so, the experiment will be repeated at regular intervals throughout the winter.

"By a comparison of 'fading' and the static curves with those of the U. S. weather map it will be possible to determine the effect of weather on such phenomena," said Mr. Smith. "By plotting the curves of 'fading'

and static in tests on stations of varying wave length, some tangible progress may be made toward discovering what frequencies are best for broadcast.

"The plan to hold the tests originated in a discovery that Chicago reception this year has failed to follow the accepted rules. There have been several clear, cold nights on which it has been impossible to hear stations 500 miles distant.

"On the other hand, there have been warm, wet nights entirely free from static and perfect for broadcast reception from distant points."
