Louis F. Swift To Retire As Swift Company Head

Chicago, Dec. 22.—(United Press)—Louis F. Swift, commanding figure in the packing industry, is preparing to relinquish the presidency of the \$340,000,000 Swift Packing company, according to rumors in LaSalle street financial circles today.

Swift, according to the rumor, will resign from the presidency in order to accept the created post of chairman of the board of directors, at the annual meeting of stockholders January 4.

Coincident with Louis Swift's resignation, it is expected that Louis's brother, Edward F. Swift, senior vice-president of the company will also resign and become chairman of the executive and finance committee.

If this arrangement does go through, the rumor has it as a certainty that Gustavus F. Swift, Jr., will be promoted to the presidency.

State's Prosperity Depends On Publicity

Indianapolis, Ind., Dec. 22.—(United Press)—Indiana's future prosperity is directly dependent upon the amount of publicity given the state, L. D. Edie, of Indiana University, declared in an address here last night.

Edie said that Indiana has all of

the natural qualifications for attracting outside capital but the state must depend on publicity to reveal to business men the opportunities of the state.

Wabash, Ind., Dec. 22. — (United Press)—Mrs. Marie Siders is none today—free under the smallest bond ever set in federal court in Indianapolis—and she has enough money to play Santa Claus to her seven children.

Arrested in Indianapolis when she attempted to pass a one dollar bill which she had raised to a ten dollar bill denomination, the woman told such a pitiful story that the hearts of the federal authorities were touched.

United States Commissioner Kern set her bond at \$2 which was promptly furnished by two officials and other employees in the federal building contributed to a Christmas fund for her children.

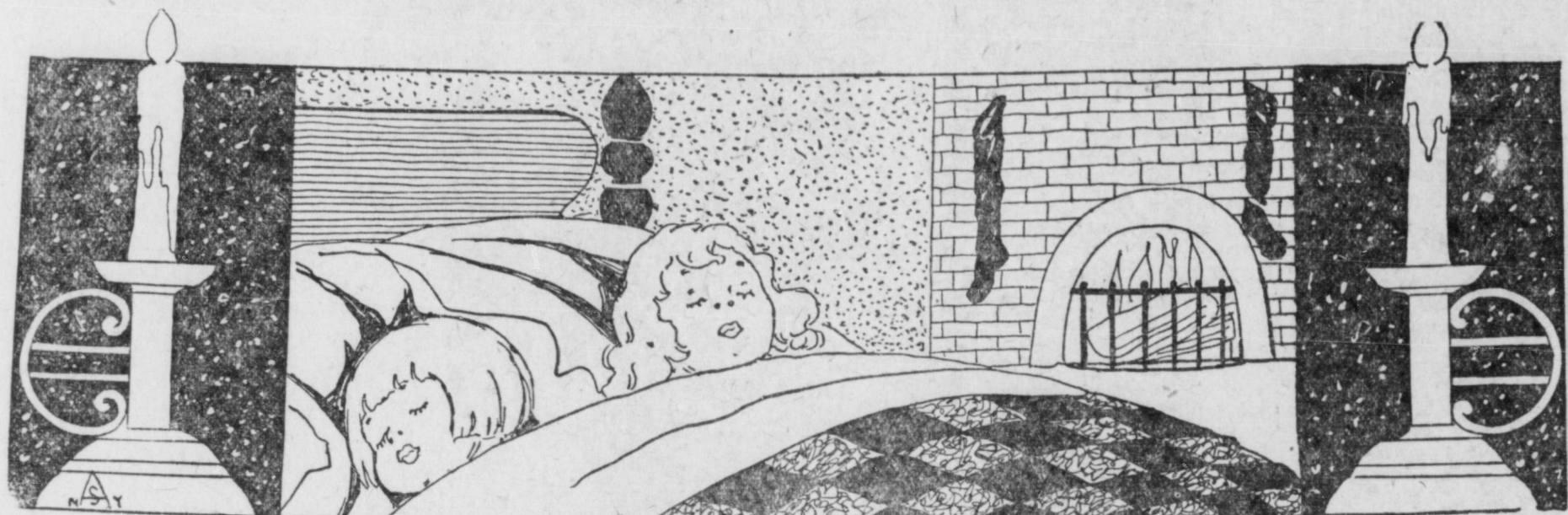
