Chicago Has No Chance To Get Army-Navy Game

Annapolis, Md., Dec. 23. — (United Press)—Chicago has no chance to get the 1926 Army-Navy football game unless a change is made in the existing agreement between the two service academies, according to navy athletic officials.
 The agreement, which has one more year to run, provides that the game shall not be played north of New York or south of Baltimore and Chicago is north of New York, they said.

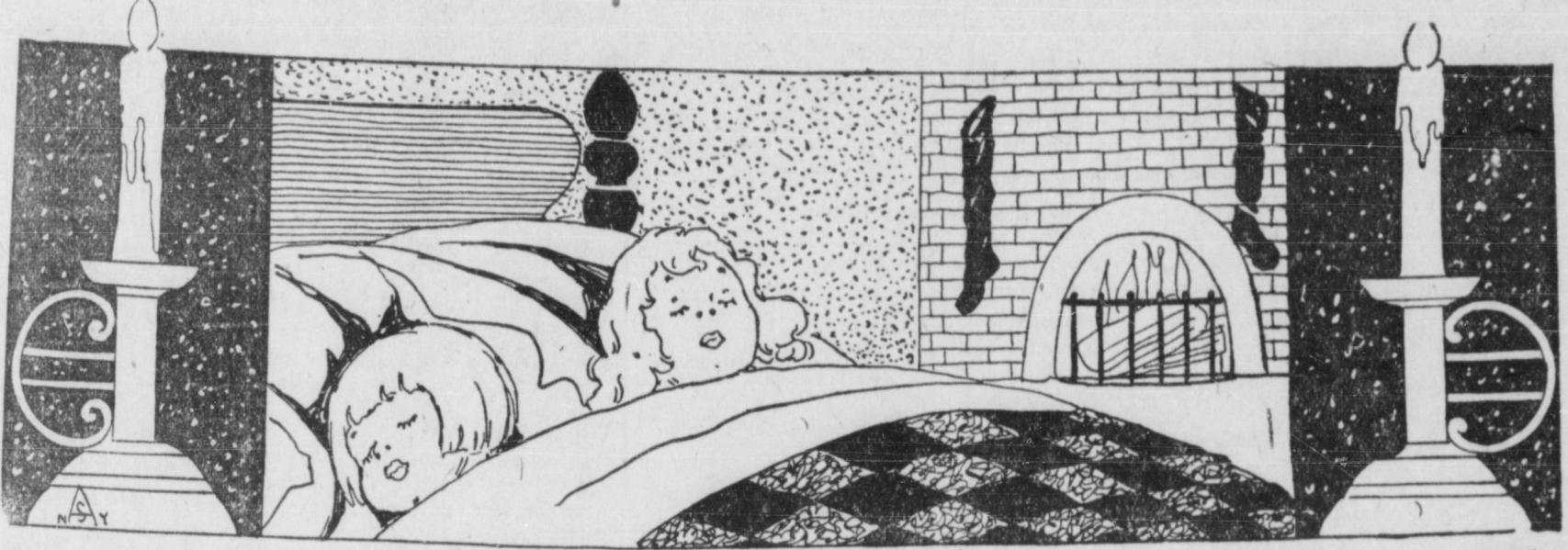
