Chicago Has No Chance
To Get Army-Navy Game

Annapolis, Md., Dec. 23. — (United Press) — Chicago has no chance to get the 1926 Army-Navy football game unless a change is made in the existing agreement between the two service academies, according to navy athletic officials.

The agreement, which has one more year to run, provides that the game shall not be played north of New York or south of Baltimore and Chicago is north of New York, they said.

Many children, with their sleds, spent yesterday coasting and hopping rides with their sleds. Many ponds and lakes are frozen and it is probable that the cold weather will continue for several days according to weather reports.

Prospects for a white Christmas were given a boost today when state weather forecasters predicted continued cold weather and probably more snow in some parts of the state during the next 24 hours.

Christmas activities start tonight, with the Community Christmas program and tree on Liberty Way. This program is conducted by the Womans club and is always attended by several hundred people, especially children. The program will start at 5 p.m.

served by the management of the American Milk Company, in whose plant the meetings were held.

Free milk was "on tap" throughout the three-day session and those attending, helped themselves generously. A guessing contest was held in connection with the registration of those present, the plan being to estimate the number of pints of milk which would be consumed during the three days. O. V. Dilling, Kirkland township

farmer, proved himself the best guesser, his estimate being 233 pints, whereas the amount consumed was 222 pints.

John J. Schwartz, of Monroe township, proved to be the second best guesser, his estimate being 210 pints. It was interesting to note that 49 different parties estimated the amount at 1,000 pints or more. Phillip D. Nussbaum of Monroe township used especially bad judgment in placing his estimate at 5,675 pints and Roy Price hardly lived up to his reputation as an authority along dairying lines when he set the mark at 2,096 points.

Wilbur Mathys, of Jefferson township, proved to be the most ardent disciple of economy, by restricting the amount to 45 pints.

To Meet Next Tuesday


