reported flood conditions.

Amsterdam reported the Netherlands lashed by a terrific gale with serious damage done in some sections. Six persons were drowned when a motor bus was blown off a ferry boat.

Belgium, too, was hard hit. A Brussels message said that all waterways were heavily flooded and that there was difficulty in reuniting some localities.

Fifteen out of 18 telephone cables linking England with Paris were disorganized. Dublin was completely shut off from communication with London, while in England 137 lines were down.


