

Many Men And DevicesDetroit, Mich., Dec. 30.—(United  
Press)—In five simultaneous raids on  
downtown gambling resorts here last  
night, police arrested a total of 591  
men and confiscated cash amounting to  
approximately \$15,000. The raids involved  
sled hammer attacks on bolted doors and search through secret  
rooms gained by concealed passages.  
Gaming instruments, dice and other  
equipment found in the establishments

Press)—An order requiring all brokers

with the state security commission

retary of state here today.

The order was issued by David Jen-  
nings, security commissioner following  
an opinion handed down by Attorney  
General Arthur Gilliom.The order will affect about 100 bro-  
kers and approximately 800 banks in all  
parts of the state, it was said.
