People have been turning away from the one that could save them and one who asks the least of them. It is not how much you do that saves you, it is the faith that you put in yourself that saves you. "This story presents Jesus in a little different relation. We look at him from a little different angle, we are looking at the soul saving Jesus. Christ would have us understand that everyone of us may touch him and there is life in the touch.
