### Monster Plane Carrying Dirigible Soon To Be Constructed At Akron

Akron, Ohio, Mar. 9.—(United Press)—A gigantic warship of the air, practically double the size of the Shenandoah and the Los Angeles, designed to carry four to six combat airplanes, will soon be constructed here, according to the announcement of Goodyear-Zeppelin Corporation officials.

Blue print plans for the new air monster were worked out in cooperation with Rear Admiral W. A. Moffet, chief of the naval bureau of aeronautics.

Improved and modernized structural details together with many new general features is expected to make the contemplated airship the strongest and fastest aircraft ever constructed.

To make possible the building of the central cabin and all the power-car units inside the ship itself, triple keels will be utilized, extending throughout the entire length, thus assuring greater sturdiness to the ship's hull. The designers regard this as a vital factor to remove the possibility of loss of an engine car or control car while flying and at the same time eliminate considerable air resistance, adding, naturally, to the speed of the airship.

If the control car of the Shenandoah had not broken free from the rest of the ship, probably the great loss of lives would not have occurred, it is said. The present designers have profited from the Shenandoah's experience in this regard.

A new type of tilting propellers, developed recently, will be used. They can be turned downward when the ship commander desires additional vertical lifting strength, and reversed when the ship is in a lightened condition to drive downward without valving or shutting off the helium gas. This feature will make possible additional maneuvering ability.

The gas bag will be 790 feet long and 135 feet in diameter. The gas capacity will be about 6,500,000 cubic

feet, more than twice the volume of either the Los Angeles or Shenandoah. Motors capable of 4800 horsepower will give the ship a maximum speed of 90 miles and hour, a cruising speed of 80 miles an hour, and a range at this speed, under average flying conditions carrying a full military load of guns and airplanes, of more than 5,000 miles.

### Change In Traffic Rules At State Capital Proposed

Indianapolis, Ind., Mar. 9.—(United Press)—Motorists today were anxiously awaiting the outcome of a move which would place stringent traffic regulations in effect in the downtown section of Indianapolis.

A proposed ordinance which would ban either right or left turns in a large area is being drafted for presentation to the city council.
