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Fort Wayne School Papers Wins Prize

Madison, Wis., April 15. — (United Press)—"South Side Times," published by the students of the South Side high school, Fort Wayne, Indiana, was adjudged the winner of the sixth All-American newspaper contest.

The contest was held under the direction of the Central Inter-Scholastic Press Association, which has its headquarters at the University of Wisconsin.

The Central High News and the Southern, both published in Minneapolis high schools, tied for second place. The West High Weekly, Minneapolis, the Scroll, of Washington high school, Milwaukee, and the Stadium World, of Tacoma, Washington, were ranked next in order.

Judges of the contest were Herbert Bayard Swope, executive editor of the New York World, Lee A. White, director of the reference department, Detroit News, and Slater W. R. May, news editor of the Portland Oregonian.
