TO HOLD COUNTY MEET AT GENEVA

County Schools To Hold Meet At Geneva Instead Of Decatur Saturday

Due to the fact that the race track at Belmont Park is covered with water in places and likely would not be in good condition by Saturday, the annual Adams County high school track and field meet will be held at Geneva next Saturday, Clifton Strickland, county superintendent of schools, stated today. The change in location for the meet was made after conditions at Belmont Park had been investigated yesterday.

The officials for the meet will be as follows: field judge, Leroy Hedges; of Lancaster high school; starter, Hansel Foley, of Monmouth high school; score keepers, E. V. Shireline, R. Hunt and E. S. Christen; timekeepers, R. M. Tyndall, J. C. Romey and J. J. Diltz; managers, W. J. Krick, E. M. Webb, and D. Colom. The meet will start at 1 o'clock sharp, since elimination heats will be held in several track events.

To Have Baseball Game.
The annual baseball game between teams from the north and south halves of the county, will be held at Geneva at 9 o'clock Saturday morning.

There will be events for both boys and girls in the track and field meet. There will be three events for girls, namely, 100-yard dash, 440-yard relay race, and baseball throw. The ten events for boys will be 100-yard dash, 440-yard dash, pole vault, mile run, 220-yard dash, shot put, running high jump, half-mile run, running broad jump, and half-mile relay race.

Bronze medals will be awarded to the winners of first place in each event and a silver loving cup will be awarded to the team scoring the high number of points. The meet was won by Geneva last year. Six schools have entered the track and field meet. They are Berne, Geneva, Hartford, Kirkland, Jefferson and Decatur. Monmouth, Pleasant Mills and Monroe failed to enter.

Decatur high school does not have a track team this year, all time being devoted to baseball, but the school has entered athletes in most of the events of the county meet.

BERNE ATHLETES IN TRACK MEET

Alpha Literary Society Beats Arenas; Team Picked For County Meet

Berne, April 15.—The Alpha literary society of the Berne high school defeated the Arena society in a track and field meet held here Monday evening, 7:15 to 4:30. The meet was held for the purpose of selecting the athletes to represent Berne in the annual Adams County high school track and field meet at Decatur next Saturday.

The rivalry was much closer than the score would indicate, both societies flying their colors and cheering their contestants in the various events.

Marvin Lehman, veteran Berne runner, cornered the most points, gleaming three firsts and one second place. He placed first in the 440-yd. dash, mile and half-mile run and second in the 220-yd. dash. In field and track events first place counts for five points, second place for three and third place for one point. Lehman runs in good form and gave all manner of indications that he had plenty of energy left should he get crowded at the county meet Saturday.

Earl Winterregg and Kermith Baumgartner tied for second place for total points, each getting two firsts and one second. Winterregg easily cleared the bar in the running high jump. He also jumped in good form in the running broad jump, and came in second in the 100-yd. dash. Baumgartner touched the tape first in the 100-yd. dash and again in the 220-yd. dash, and placed second for the running broad jump.
